1. About

- All uniforms must have emblem stitched on them.
- The school uniform is obligatory on all school days and official functions.

16. Promotions

- Missing out on tests and activity based evaluations directly affect the promotion of the students to the next class at the end of the academic year.
- To qualify for a subject, student must obtain a minimum of grade 'D'.
- Results will be published on the school notice board on specified dates mentioned at the time. Intimation by other means is not entertained.
- Results will be withheld in cases of fee defaulters and any other dues owing to the departments concerned.
- Overall performance of the candidate is based on the achievement in Scholastic as well as Co-scholastic areas and Co-curricular Activities. The active involvement/interest in co-scholastic activities, positive attitude towards mentors and school programmes help the child to upgrade his/her co-scholastic grades.
- 90% attendance is must for promotion to next class.
- Results declared at the end of the sessions are final in all cases unless otherwise permitted.
- Re-tests/exams are not permitted unless there is special permission from the Principal.

17. Attendance & Leave Procedure

Coming to school regularly is an integral part of a student's life.

- Every student must without fail, attend classes on the re-openening day after each short or long break. Attendance is compulsory on the first day (re-opening day) of the academic year.
- No student will be allowed to attend class, next day, without a leave letter
 duly signed by the parent. The same must be noted in the 'Record of
 Absence' page in the diary.
- If a student is absent for 3 consecutive days, a medical certificate by a doctor must be provided.
- In case a student absents himself/herself from school for more than 15 days, prior permission must be taken from Principal /Class Mentor. Failure to do so will call for removal of student's name from the roll.
- A student who is found to be habitually absent without any bonafide reason or any explanation from parents or guardians is liable to have,

his/her name struck off from the roll and information will be passed on to parents/guardian.

- Half-day leave is not allowed unless otherwise permitted.
- Students are not allowed to leave the school without prior permission.
 They can leave by means of a gate pass approved by the Principal or Section Mentor.

18. Tardiness

- All students are expected to be in school 5 minutes before the last warning bell that goes off in the morning at 08.25.
- Those coming by private vehicles are expected to be on time.
- Any student arriving to school after 08.25 a.m. must obtain a permission slip from the Principal's office, to enter the classroom.
- A marking will be made in the late comer's column in the diary, for those who arrive late to school.
- Three consecutive late coming will be seriously dealt with and parents will be called to the office to meet the Principal.
- In case the school bus is delayed due to some reason the student will not be marked late.
- In the case of a student not being at the boarding point on time and making the school bus wait, that particular student will be marked late in his/her diary.

 another week. However, the librarian can exercise the right to call for a
 book, at any time, from the borrower.
- Books must be properly examined before leaving the librarian's desk and in
 case of any damage at the time of issuance must be reported immediately.
 Books borrowed from the library should be kept neat at all times and no
 markings, underlining or scribbling of any kind is permitted.
- The student in whose name the library book is issued will be held solely responsible for any damages found on return.
- A fine of Rs. 5/- will be charged per day if the book is not returned by due
 date. If books are lost, damaged or defaced, a fine amounting to double
 the cost of book will be charged. In case of any dispute the Principal's
 decision shall be final and binding.
- In case the student loses his library card, a duplicate card will be issued at a cost of Rs. 25/-.
- Students reading in the library must maintain silence at all times.
- Students must leave their footwear outside the library before entering
 the place. Internet facility is available in the library and can be used
 with prior approval from the Principal and under the supervision of the
 mentor concerned.

ii. Transportation

School buses are plying to different destinations.

- Parents of students availing school transportation must contact the transportation department/administrative office to get information about the available routes, boarding points, bus number and applicable bus fee. Students can avail the school bus facility only after remitting the bus fee and obtaining Journey ID Card from the office. They must also ensure that they carry it on all school days.
- Parents/Guardians must ensure that their children board the bus safely and is collected on return.
- Parents of those students coming by private vans must submit a written letter with details about the driver, a copy of any ID card of the person concerned and that of the van.

• In case there is a change in the person who is collecting the student or change of van, the details must be informed at the administration desk and discussed with the class mentor. This ensures safety of our students.

iii. Audio Visual Room

 There are two well-equipped audio visual rooms in the school which the students are allowed to use only under the supervision of their respective mentors.

iv. Atal Tinkering Laborataries

• In the Atal Tinkering Lab funded by Niti Ayog, Govt. of India, where the students will get a chance to work with tools and equipments to understand what, how and why aspects of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths.) The objective of this scheme is to foster curiosity, creativity and imagination in young minds and inculcate skills such as design mind-set, computational thinking, adaptive learning, physical computing etc.

v. Toilets

Separate toilets are maintained for both boys and girls. The students
must ensure that they use the toilet properly and keep it dry as much as
possible. Remember other fellow students need to use the facility, so
ensure that it is left clean after use. Students are not expected to linger
around or inside the toilets unnecessarily.

vi. Drinking Water

 Water purifiers are provided on all the floors and students can use the same for drinking water. Remember water is valuable and wastage is not entertained. No student must be found lingering near the purifiers unnecessarily.

vii. First Aid

 A first aid room and well stocked first aid kit is made available in the school. Minor wounds, bruise or headaches and such would be treated at the school. However, if there are serious wounds or illness the student will be transported to the nearest clinic or hospital and the parents would be intimated immediately.

viii. Counsellor

A full-time counsellor is appointed in the campus. Parents can meet the
respective class mentors to refer their child to the counsellor if required.
If a mentor finds that a student requires counselling, she may refer the
child to the counsellor without fail.

ix. Boarding Home

 There is a boarding home available only for the girls of standards XI & XII at present, situated beside the school inside Mar Ivanios Vidya Nagar.

x. Interactive Intelligent Panels

To enhance the effectiveness of the teaching process, interactive panels are
installed in class rooms. Hi-Tech class rooms help students understand
the class more effectively using charts, graphs and other visual aids.

xi. Conference Hall

 We host all the official meetings and conferences in our Air conditioned conference hall, with a seating capacity, to comfortably accommodate over 200 people.

xii. German and French language classes

• Students of classes V to X can opt for a German and French language learning Programme.

xiii. Career Guidance

 Orientation for various academic programmes are organized for students to make the right choice after their 12th Std.

xiv.Lab facility

 Lab facilities for Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Computer, Maths & Geography are made available at the school strictly under the supervision of the mentors and lab assistants.

21. GENERAL RULES / DISCIPLINE

- i. Students must ensure that they maintain punctuality, regular attendance, good manners, cleanliness and devotion to studies at school.
- ii. Students must carry their school diary on all school days.
- iii. Students must be in proper uniform at all times without fail. Their ID card need to be worn at all times and should be visible to the mentor or Principal.
- iv. Students must always come in school uniform even if they do not intend to attend classes.
- v. Students are expected to attend the morning assemblies conducted in the school unless otherwise permitted by the principal or class mentor, provided prior permission is taken by the parent in writing.

- vi. Students are expected to behave courteously towards the school staff, fellow students and any visitor in the school.
- vii. Every student must ensure that they bring their text books, note books and the necessary stationery as per the time table provided.
- viii. Strict silence and keen observance must be practised during class hours. Any student found misbehaving or restless in the class while the mentor is in the class, a verbal warning will be given first. If the student misbehaves for the second time, he/she will be reported at the Principal's office and if repeated for the third time parents will be informed to meet the class mentor. And if the student still persists with the misbehaviour, he/ she will be dealt with strict disciplinary action.
- ix. If a mentor does not come to class as per the timetable, the students are to remain silently seated in their seats and the class representative alone can go to the staffroom to inform the mentor if present. Upon absence of the mentor, they may report to the Principal's office/Section Mentor and appropriate substitution will be arranged.
- x. Students must refrain from any sort of foul language or physical fights inside and outside school campus.
- xi. It is the responsibility of each student to take care of their belongings.
- xii. Students must complete and submit their classwork, homework, assignment or project within deadlines. In case of any delay, the mentors concerned must be informed and it is at the sole discretion of the mentor to give extension period or not.
- xiii. Students must not resort to haphazard movements of hands and legs that may irritate fellow bench mates.
- xiv. While in the campus students must ensure that they do not run around or play in such a way that poses harm to others in the campus.
- xv. The students are provided with a playground where they can play or run around during their assigned PT hours or breaks.
- xvi. Please refrain from any such act like pushing, kicking, tugging or even using some object that can inflict pain on others.
- xvii. While walking in the corridors to move for the assembly, to other classrooms, to the audio-visual room or any other place in the campus designated, students must ensure they walk in a line at all times.

- xviii. Do not shout or make any other disturbing noises like whistling or so when moving around in the campus.
- xix. Students are expected to be soft spoken at all times. You are not to raise your voice towards your teachers or peers or the support staff.
- xx. No valuable articles must be brought to school and in case any such items are brought and lost the school takes no responsibilities.
- xxi. Mobile phones, cameras, other digital gadgets, pen drives, CDs or so are not allowed in the school, even during any special occasions or celebrations. If anyone is found in possession of unwanted items those will be immediately confiscated, which will be released after 6 months upon producing an apology letter duly signed by the parents/guardian. Parent/Guardian must ensure that they come in person to collect the confiscated item. Repetition of the same will result in strict disciplinary action.
- xxii. If any awkward situation, event or behaviour is noticed a student must ensure that it is reported to their class mentor without fail.
- xxiii. If any fellow student is ill or meets with an accident in the campus the same must be reported immediately to the class mentor.
- xxiv. Students are not allowed to leave the school during school hours and are prohibited from having contact with strangers.
- xxv. Students travelling by school buses must queue up in the aisle and walk towards the gate strictly maintaining the line. Patience must be maintained without rushing at all times.
- xxvi. All students are expected to obey all the instructions provided from time to time by their mentors, class leaders, school leaders and prefects.
- xxvii. Wearing gold ornaments is strictly prohibited inside the school campus.
- xxviii. The medium of communication inside the school campus is English.
- xxix. Students should wish the mentors, as soon as they come across them.

22. SCHOOL LEADERS / PREFECTS

 A team of school leaders and prefects are carefully chosen at the beginning of the academic year. Badges will be provided to recognize them.

- ii. They will be in charge of general discipline and cleanliness of the campus.
- iii. They will be functioning along with the school authorities to ensure harmony amongst students and the school.
- iv. Any sort of unacceptable behaviour from the leaders or prefects that can tarnish the goodwill of the school will call for removal of the badge without further explanations.
- v. All students are expected to obey the assigned leaders and prefects at all times

23. SCHOOL SPORTS DAY

- Students are divided into different houses and the decision of the PT instructors on these remains final.
- ii. Respective T-Shirts representing the house colours will be provided from the school after taking appropriate measurements. These will be distributed by the class mentors on receipt of the charges intimated at the time.
- iii. Each student must buy the Sports uniform from the school.

24. KIDS' DAY

The Kids' Day celebrations are conducted in the month of November. Students from LKG to grade IV participate in the same.

25. SCHOOL ANNUAL DAY

- i. The annual day celebrations are conducted towards the end of the academic year. Students from Grade V to XII participate in the same.
- ii. Those students who are not participating in any programme must come in proper uniform with ID card.
- iii. Any student found violating the rules will not be allowed in the premises during the event.
- iv. Any student staying back after their performance is expected to change into their complete school uniform before taking seats amongst audience.

26. INTER SCHOOL COMPETITION

- i School promotes interschool competitions and encourages students to participate in the same.
- ii. While at another school, students must maintain perfect discipline as they represent the school.

- iii. If the competition is held at Sarvodaya Central Vidyalaya, the students need to ensure that mentors and students from other schools are made to feel comfortable at our premises.
- iv. Each student must ensure that they are into healthy competitions. Remember achievements and failures are part of life. Take it in your stride.
- v. Transportation to another school will be provided by the school unless otherwise specified.
- We must learn to appreciate the winners whole heartedly no matter what.

27. PRIZES AND AWARDS

- i. Proficiency prizes: Students of each class who score the maximum marks in all class examinations will be awarded proficiency prizes.
- ii. Rev. Fr. George Mathew Endowment Prize: Instituted by the management, staff and students of the school, to be awarded to a student who scores the highest mark in Science Stream in the AISSCE examination.
- iii. Dr. K. T. Cherian Panicker Endowment Prize: Instituted by Dr. K. T. Cherian Panicker, former Principal of the School, to be awarded to a student who scores the highest mark in Humanities Stream in the AISSCE Examination and also to the topper in the AISSE Examination.

28. VISITORS

- i. Visitors to the school are not allowed direct access to classrooms.
- ii. They have to come to the Reception and take prior permission to meet the principal.
- iii. In order to meet the class mentor or any other subject teacher prior permission must be taken over the phone or in writing from the principal.

29. NOTE TO PARENTS / GUARDIAN

Parents and mentors together play a great role in shaping a child into a responsible, courteous, respectable individual. Hence, parents are requested to cooperate with the mentors in all matters related to school life of their child.

- i. The school Diary is the primary source of communication at all times between the parents and the mentors.
- ii. Kindly go through the diary on a daily basis.

- iii. Please ensure that the class mentor is always informed if your child is not able to attend classes due to some reason.
- iv. Please make sure that the Leave Record is appropriately filled in when your child is resuming school immediately after the break.
- v. Please make sure that you send your child to school in complete and proper uniform.
- vi. It is the duty of the parent to ensure that your child attends school in a presentable manner i.e. ironed and clean uniform, combed hair, polished shoes etc.
- vii. Please make sure that you communicate with your child and ask about their day at school to ensure everything is well.
- viii. Please do not rebuke or abuse your child if they do not meet your expectations both academically and co-scholastically.
- ix. Please remember to encourage your child, persistently but politely, as our constant love and encouragement develop a child in a positive manner.
- x. Please do a self analysis to ensure that you do not lag in taking care of your child's progress.
- xi. Please ensure that you do not criticize or belittle your child's mentor in front of him/her.
- xii. If your child complains of anything that happened at school, please remain calm and try to contact the class mentor who will help you out at all times. Children are very imaginative and it is possible they might see everything to extremes and exaggerate what they say, out of fear or for attention. If the issue seems to prevail you may approach the Principal.
- xiii. Genuine suggestions or complaints are accepted with the best of intentions.
- xiv. Parents whose children are in the lower classes, are requested to label their child's belongings accordingly. Remember they are very small children and it is possible that they can misplace or lose their belongings. However, you may never scold them, instead enquire with the school. Any lost and found item will be kept in safe custody for a period of two weeks till the owner claims it.
- xv. Parents must ensure that their child/children carry sufficient water in a

water bottle, snacks or breakfast as required and lunch.

xvi. Parents must ensure that they send their child to school well equipped with sufficient stationery, handkerchief, napkins, etc. after discussing with the class mentor.

xvii. School does not encourage private tuitions.

30. GOOD MANNERS

Every pupil, both in the School and the Boarding, is expected to behave in a refined and gracious manner. However watchful we are, roughness and lack of politeness unconsciously enter our behaviour and manners causing annoyance to others. The following guidelines will be very useful for your todays and tomorrows.

i. ATHOME

Your home is a place of love. Express your love and gratitude towards your parents for all that they do for you. Be polite and pleasing to all members of your family. When you leave home, let your parents know where you go and when you'll return. Use the terms "Please", "I am sorry", "Thank you", "Excuse me", etc. as required. Keep your mind free from jealousy or envy. Avoid quarrelling. When you enter your house make sure that your foot wear and feet are clean. Open the door gently to get in. Arrange all your belongings in your house in an orderly way. Keep your table clean; dust your room as often as necessary. When you listen to the Radio or watch T.V. see that others are not disturbed. Deposit all waste things in a basket which must be placed in a corner. Keep an atmosphere of affection, concern, cheerfulness and selflessness in the place you live.

"How sweet, sweet home, There is no place Like a happy home" (John Milton)

ii. AT SCHOOL

School is your second home though it is a place where you receive instructions. Be punctual for class and be orderly in all your movements. Follow your conscience in everything. Accept that "Right is right and wrong is wrong". Be sincere and frank with your mentors. Love them and greet them affectionately. Be proud of your School.

In the class: Sit at the place assigned to you. Don't cause discomfort to your neighbour. Respect and obey your class leader. Don't write anything on the desk or walls. Don't scatter your books on the desk.

Take out your books from the bags as required. Attend all classes without fail.

When you go to the office of Fr. Manager, Fr. Principal, Warden or any mentor, knock at the door gently. When he says, "Come in" enter the room and greet him/her. Don't sit unless you are told to sit. Then say "Thank you" and talk clearly and distinctly. If you do not hear properly what is spoken to you, say 'I beg your pardon, Father/Sir'. Don't say "What?". Listen carefully and answer to the question, When leaving the room, say respectfully "Thank You, Father/Sir".

When you are in their rooms, don't touch anything on the table or show curiosity or stare at things. Never read any letters on the table, Don't argue with others. Put forward your request politely. Abide by their decisions. If you have to wait at others doors, never peep, or stay too close within hearing range or cough to indicate your presence.

iii. STUDY

Pay attention to study. Schedule the time, find out important ideas, ask yourself questions and write the answers down. Recall and test your memory. Study calmly and silently.

iv. CLEANLINESS

Cleanliness is next to Godliness. Keep your body clean always. Change your clothes regularly. Keep a handkerchief always with you. Keep your mouth habitually closed; Breathe out through your nose and not through the mouth. Keep the bath rooms and toilets clean after use. Rinse the bucket and empty it after use. Avoid coughing and sniffing loudly while in company. Spitting, cracking fingers, poking fingers into your ears, nose, teeth or hair in public are ugly habits, always use your right hand for giving and taking.

v BEDROOM

Bedroom is a place of rest. Avoid all kinds of noise. Keep your bed always clean and tidy. Change sheets and pillow covers regularly. Don't keep anything unclean in the bedroom. Use lights and fans according to your needs.

vi. DRESS

Dress neatly and modestly. It must suit your body and purse. The colours you choose must match your body. Don't blindly follow fashions. Act on your convictions.

vii. TABLE MANNERS

Appear at the dining table in a neat and presentable manner. Handle the chair, plates, cups and glasses with care. Don't drag them. Take a little food at a time or else you may waste it. Set apart a small area in the plate for depositing waste. It should not be thrown around the plate or on the floor. If you want to talk during meals, cover your mouth with the left hand. Don't lean on the table. When you eat, keep a napkin across your lap which may be useful for wiping lips. "Eat to live and do not live to eat. "Avoid giving the impression of being greedy. If the food is hot, do not blow on it. Don't gulp your food. Don't be hasty in eating. Don't look enviously into other's plates. If you find an insect or hair in the food, don't make a fuss about it or don't call the attention of others. Don't be selective when a dish is passed on to you. Take what is required and pass it on to your neighbour. If you want anything, ask for it, saying "please". Don't pick your teeth while at the table. Do it outside. Pay compliments if you have enjoyed the meal.

viii. CONVERSATION

Speak in a delightful manner, greet your companions joyously. Let a word of praise, appreciation, or congratulation be always found in your talk. Avoid scandalous talk and vulgar words. Use wit and humour often. Treat everyone with respect and honour. Be sincere and frank with your companions. Think twice before you talk. Accept all your mistakes and faults graciously. Try to make others happy and cheerful.

ix. USING THE PHONE

When you are contacting a person over the phone, put all your kindness, refinement and interest in your voice. Speak clearly, distinctly and pleasantly in a subdued voice. When someone at the other end takes the phone, say who you are and ask for the person you want. Try to be short. At the end of the conversation, express gratitude and thanks.

x. ON THE ROAD

When you are in the street, keep the rules of the road. Be decent and gentle in walking. Avoid staring and pointing at others. Avoid noisy talk. Just salute your acquaintances and elders. While crossing a road, look at the signals. Always walk by the right-hand side of the road. Use the foot path. Take care of yourself. When you have to follow queue system, wait patiently for your turn. Skipping others and taking unjust advantage is an uncultured habit.

xi. IMPORTANT SIGNALS AND TRAFFIC RULES

Red Light - Indicates you should stop

Yellow Light - Indicates you should wait for green signal

Green Light - Indicates you should start moving

Hand signals: At times, hand signals are very necessary. They should be shown clearly outside the vehicle in order to make them visible for others. When slowing down the vehicle, we should extend our arm and swing it up and down; when stopping, we should raise our forearm vertically; when turning right, we should extend our arm straight out, palm to the front; when turning left, we should extend our arm and rotate it in an anticlockwise direction.

Traffic Rules: Some general rules of the road are to

- (a) Keep left.
- (b) Give way to vehicles passing on the right side.
- (c) Give signals whenever turning right or left.
- (d) Do not cross the yellow line dividing the road.
- (e) Do not cross the stop line.
- (f) Maintain adequate distance from the vehicle ahead of you.
- $(g) \ \ Carry \ only \ one \ pillion \ rider \ if \ driving \ two \ wheelers.$
- (h) Take extra precautions while overtaking to ensure safety.
- (i) Follow the red, yellow and green signals at the crossing.
- (j) Use helmet if driving a two wheeler and a safety belt if driving a four wheeler.


xii. PLACES OF WORSHIP




